Offering Report

The General Fund offering and net online contributions for November 9, 2014 were **\$9413.51**.

As of the second week in November expenses for 2014 were \$384,000 while income was \$338,336 leaving a shortfall of \$45,664. This is higher because many expenses are paid at the beginning of the month but offerings come throughout the month. To cover budgeted expenses for congregational activities, local and worldwide mission, service activities, and to pay the mortgage on our building, contributions will need to average \$12,815 per Sunday for the rest of the year. As cash flow fluctuates throughout the year, we use balances in special funds as needed. Strong year end giving in past years has allowed us to finish the year with no shortfall. The church board encourages everyone to contribute generously toward meeting this goal for 2014.
