14 Slate Hillers Join Christian Witness at 45th Mechanicsburg CROP Walk

On a beautiful crisp fall day, Slate Hillers and family walked in solidarity with the hungry. Walking with over 150 other Christians from our local community, they prayed and walked to raise funds to end hunger. Well, they all didn't walk. Matt and Ben Fasick RAN the 3.1 mile (5K) course through the borough of Mechanicsburg. Matt had enough left in his energy tank to run the 5K course a second time!

Marking the 45th Anniversary of the Mechanicsburg CROP Walk, the October 23rd event featured representatives from over a dozen local churches including:

Slate Hill walkers/runners numbered 14 in all. St. John Lutheran Church had about 25 walkers, the most from any participating congregation. Slate Hillers raised about \$500. 25% of those funds will go to New Hope Ministries to address emergency needs locally. 75% of those funds will go to alleviate hunger in areas of our world which New Hope isn't able to reach.

Slate Hill Mennonite Church Celebrates the Bicentennial of the First Meeting House on the Hill

Good weather and wonderful attendance blessed Slate Hill Mennonite Church's Bicentennial celebrating the first meeting house and church structure on its grounds.

In the planning for approximately 6 months, the two-day festivities (Saturday, October 8 and Sunday, October 9) started with two, two-hour bus tours in the surrounding region highlighting various homesteads of church founders, cemeteries and other notable sites. Tour details in 2016 were expanded by Caleb Miller and Christopher Zimmerman, both members of the church. Their expanded details were based on Joseph Hess's tour notes from similar previous tours. On this Saturday, seats were full and participants well-informed.

On Sunday, hundreds of invited guests such as previous bishops and pastors, family members and friends began to fill the sanctuary. Spread around the church and Fellowship Hall (itself a previous church) were numerous items from the church's archives and a Bicentennial quilt crafted by Betty Zimmerman, wife of former pastor Norman Zimmerman.

A centennial service was conducted by Paul Nisly, a former pastor of and previous Bishop to this congregation, concentrating on the church's solid foundation as a caring Mennonite community of believers. Following this service, while children made their way to Sunday School, David Weaver-Zercher provided details on why the founding families journeyed to Lancaster and then Cumberland County to establish the Martin's Meeting House in 1816.

2016 Bicentennial planning chair, Paul Nisly, "It was such a pleasure to see so many of our family and friends journey up the hill to join in the festivities, reunite, share stories and joy in fellowship".

Following a fellowship lunch, Lena Brown and Rathsamy Onelangsy reviewed the establishment of the Slate Hill South-East Asian Ministries outreach that continues as an active worship group today. Rathsamy "Rick" and Yoomie Onelangsy also shared their very deep love of God and their treasured church family.

As a continuing statement of the valued leadership of women at Slate Hill, a video interview with Florence Detweiler (who is approaching her 100th birthday) guided Bicentennial attendees through her personal and spiritual path of service to the church. This was followed by a dialogue between Mae Asper and Rosalie (Hess) Roland. Their reminiscing provided the attendees with a deep appreciation for the strength and inspired direction of women at Slate Hill.

Following a closing prayer by Pastor Lynn Shertzer, attendees could attend an informative cemetery tour by Christopher Zimmerman.














Harvest on the Hill Reprints Available for the Holidays

Hittin' the Books!

As many of you know, I am currently working toward a Master's in Counseling on the Marriage, Couple, and Family Counseling (MCFC) Track at Messiah College. The church board has chosen to provide funding towards my graduate credits. Since YOU are part of that equation, I use Hilltop articles like this to keep you informed of my progress.



Early November finds me in the second week of my late fall class, Psychopathology and Diagnosis. This course thoroughly explores the DSM-5 (Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders) and combines the art and science of diagnosis. Marriage and Family Therapists and other Professional Counselors diagnose clients as a foundation for treatment planning and as part of communication with primary care physicians, psychiatrists, and insurance companies. According to the Centers for Disease Control, approximately 50 percent of adults in the United States will experience mental illness at some point during their lifetime. An accurate diagnosis can be an important step in the journey toward wellness.

Each week of the course involves writing mental status examinations, primary and secondary diagnoses, treatment plans, and other data for fictional clients. During this course, we'll also function as "clients" for each other, presenting with a secret diagnosis for peers to uncover. As I write I'm quite early into this course, but so far thoroughly enjoying the "puzzle" of diagnosis. With hundreds of disorders, many with specifiers and subtypes, and dozens of other areas that may be a focus of clinical attention, the DSM-5 certainly has plenty to puzzle over!

Last month I wrote about my search for a practicum placement. Thank you to those of you who joined in prayer for that process. I am delighted to share that God has provided a practicum site for Spring, 2017! Beginning in January, I'll be spending time each week at Daybreak Church in Mechanicsburg under the supervision of their Director of Relational Health. This site will provide opportunities for individual, couple, family, and group counseling in a church-based setting. I could not imagine a more ideal fit as I work to refine and enhance skills I use here at my work at Slate Hill.

Thank you for your support of my education. I continue to find that this learning enhances my ministry here at Slate Hill. Praise be to God for opportunities to support each other's physical, emotional, and spiritual wellness as we strive to be a community that is *Living Our Faith*!

Directions to Cumberland Vista from Rt. 15 and Lisburn Road

Head west on Lisburn Road 1.3 miles. At traffic light at Williams Grove Road make a LEFT (heading south) for 2.1 miles. At stop sign at 74 North (Carlisle Road/York Road) make a RIGHT. Go 0.5 miles. Slow down as you approach The Meeting House (formerly called Cumberland Valley Brethren In Christ Church) which will be on your left. Make a LEFT into the church parking lot and keep going straight up the driveway on the hill. It will bear to the right then curve to the left at the top of the hill where you can either park in front of, or behind, the Cumberland Vista home. Meetings and events usually begin in the basement. For special events (cooking/baking, etc.) we usually converge on the first floor which is the top entrance.
