tech4Tanzania Today

After months of waiting, prayers of hope, pleading, anger, and despair our hearts turn to rejoicing and thanks to God who has delivered our container of medical and educational supplies into south central Tanzania.

Friends from Slate Hill have worked in the past year to gather supplies, raise money and offer encouragement to this fledgling ministry across denominational lines. News and pictures are pouring in with shouts of joy for God has raised life from our abandoned effort to deliver these much-needed supplies. With relentless work, the recipients gathered and protested to the government, the shipping offices, and the storage owners to release the container for planned distribution.

Fees were reduced, trucking was arranged, additional money was gathered and everything fell in place. The accrued fees, more than \$23,000, were eventually reduced significantly so that combined resources from tech4Tanzania, the Lower Susquehanna Synod of Lutherans, and the Tanzanian recipients could liberate and deliver the container as originally intended.

Some pictures are included here and others will be on the bulletin board at Church. Thanks be to God and all whose hearts, hands, and prayers contributed to this joy.

Creation 2015

From Wednesday, June 24 through Sunday, June 28, 17 youth attended the Creation Festival near Mt. Union, PA. Among these youth were some who have grown up at Slate Hill, some who were new to Slate Hill, and some with no previous church experience who came along as friends. Each one was significantly impacted by the experience! Six adults assisted with this group in either full or part-time capacity. Thanks to Carreasa Jenkins, Rich Musselman, Maria Malay, Ben Simcox, Jen Musselman, and Joy Fasick for being a part of the action as well as others who worked behind-the-scenes to make the trip possible. Below is a first-hand account from one of our youth, Hope Onelangsy.

This was my second time going to Creation, and trust me, I was not expecting this much mud and rain. My whole goal at Creation was to strengthen my relationship with God and make new friends, and I'm happy to say that both of those goals have been achieved. The last time I went, I was just excited for the bands, and sure, I was this time too, but this year was different; it's crazy to think that my best memory of Creation was hearing the speakers. Their experiences with God opened my mind and heart up to the possibilities that our Lord opens us up to.

There was one guy, Bob Lentz, he talked about forgiveness, I believe. His story was that in his family, there was a shooting. A young father, his one daughter, and his wife were all shot several times while trying to feed ducks. The mother and the other daughter survived, but tragically, the father and eleven year old daughter died. I remember that I was mad at the shooter for breaking a family, but Bob then said, "The father's last words were I forgive you." I was confused as to why he would forgive such a man, but I understand that you can't live life with that weight on your shoulders. Jesus died for our sins, everybody's sins, so we have to forgive those that do wrong even if it's not in the best opinion.


