



Updated Scripture Translation Statistics

Wycliffe recently published their updated statistics for 2016. Over 4 million more people now have access to God's Word in their own language through the Bibles which were completed in the last year!



Our ministry, as part of the global Bible translation movement, has been possible for these past 20 years because you've sacrificed funds and time in prayer to keep us moving. Thanks so much!

God's Word is now available in 3,223 languages (note however that "some Scripture" may be just a small portion of the Bible).

More than 100 mission orgs with staff from over 60 countries are translating the Bible for 2,400 of the world's languages.

1,700 people groups still don't have even one verse of the God's Word in their language. When we joined Wycliffe, that number was around 3,000 so praise the Lord that great progress is being made!

An ever increasing number of Scripture products are now in digital formats as text, audio and video. These are often available on websites, social media or through a variety of phone apps, as well as in formats that can be easily shared phone-to-phone in places with limited internet.

Also in 2016, ministries that we partner with...

- YouVersion (a mobile phone app) celebrated making Scripture available in 1000+ languages;
- Faith Comes by Hearing now has audio scriptures in more than 1000 languages; and
- The JESUS film is available in over 1460 languages.



SHMC had 14 walkers participate in the 2016 Crop Walk - the 45th Walk held in the Mechanicsburg area. This industrious group raised \$673.00 of the grand total to help alleviate local and world hunger!

The Lehman family (Carl, Mabel, Dean, Bonnie, and Noreen) have been Slate Hill's most consistent CROP Walkers through the years. Ten years ago, over 30 walkers from SHMC participated setting the record for the largest group to participate. Thankfully, today, many churches have up to 40 walkers raising funds to feed the hungry.

This year the Mechanicsburg/Camp Hill walk set a goal of \$15,000 which, unfortunately, was not attained although it was slightly higher than funds raised in the last few years. Thirteen different churches participated in the Walk this year.

Plan now to join this very worthwhile endeavor next fall, either by soliciting donors for funds and walking or by donating funds to a walker. Groups have more fun - enlist the help of your small group, Sunday School Class, or relatives, friends, and neighbors.
