Volunteers needed!

On Friday, November 16, we need volunteers to help build the walls of a two bedroom house that will be sent to Texas for Eddie Garcia, whose home was damaged beyond repair by Hurricane Harvey last year. We will be building the home in the parking lot of the MDS office at 583 Airport Rd, Lititz, PA 17543.



Volunteers are needed to serve from 9:00am to 5:30pm in 2.5 hour shifts. You can register for multiple shifts, but may only be scheduled for one slot, to allow for broader participation from other interested volunteers.*

On Saturday, November 17, volunteers are also needed from 8:00am to 12:00pm to disassemble the home and load the truck.

Last year, Extraordinary Give donors generously supported Mennonite Disaster Service to help people impacted by Hurricanes Harvey, Irma and Maria. Twenty Walked to Feed the Hungry!

"I'm doing this next year!" exclaimed Chris Witmer. A resident from Cumberland Vista, Chris had just finished walking his first 5K/3.1 miles. The occasion was the 2018 Mechanicsburg CROP Walk in which a total of 20 friends of Slate Hill Mennonite participated on Sunday, October 21, 2018.

Several of the walkers were sponsored by others in the congregation although many walkers sponsored themselves. Twenty-five percent of the proceeds raised by the 150 walkers from about ten area participating churches was given to the Mechanicsburg Meals on Wheels program. The other 75% was donated to assist the work of Church World Service to address the most hungry in our world.

Walkers were also invited to bring donations of canned goods for New Hope Ministries which netted 172 pounds of non-perishable food.
