# THE LONGENECKER FAMILY

Serving in Burkina Faso

Dear Slate Hill Church,

Merry Christmas! This year, instead of a white Christmas, we will enjoy a red one. Harmattan season has brought clouds of red dust that settle thickly on everything. We can see, touch, smell, and even taste it. But it has also brought cooler temperatures, and we've been enjoying our chilly mornings in the low 80s.

We've now been in Burkina over six months and feel much more at home. Joseph has taken to seeing how many bananas he can buy for 500 CFA (86 cents), and his record is 11 decently large bananas at a total of 24 cents a pound. In October, we moved into the house that will be our home for the foreseeable future, and we were glad to finally unpack and settle in. Very generously, the family who lived here before us moved into the guest house four months before their departure date so we could move straight here.

The drill rig has been running for the past two months, and Joseph has found and fixed several problems in the design. He also has a hole 30 feet deep, which puts him in the water table and stops further progress until he can put casing down to hold the hole open. He will continue to experiment with this machine until it has reached the limit of its capabilities then build an improved model. Erin continues to write for HOPE International part-time and is also writing monthly e-newsletters for Open Door Development, our local project (let us know if you'd like to receive them!).

Will loves bouncing in his jumper. He jumps so joyously that he bottoms out the spring on one end and goes airborne on the other. Lucie, seeing his joy, grabs him and, with a giant push, sends him swinging off in a wide arc across the living room, as William chortles with glee. Daddy and Mommy look up at the ceiling, where a rather small eye hook is holding this contraption. Lucie loves to narrate her life, whether it's something she has just done, has heard us talking about doing, or believes she will be doing shortly.

We are grateful for your support, whether it be through prayer, emails and letters of encouragement, or giving. Wishing you a joyous celebration of our Savior's birth!

## FRIENDS OF SHIRATI

Friends of Shirati, a nonprofit that supports the work of the Shirati Hospital in Tanzania, is grateful for funds received from the chicken barbecue at Slate Hill. The money is supporting scholarships for staff at the hospital, which is owned by the Tanzania Mennonite Church and serves communities near Lake Victoria.

Generous donations such as those from the Slate Hill barbecue funds and regular donations via Slate Hill's Evangelism, Peace, and Service Commission will help to expand a cervical cancer screening program at the hospital. Cervical cancer screening and treatment are often unavailable to rural women in Tanzania. There are only four centers that treat cancer in Tanzania, and the nearest center to Shirati is more than five hours away. Through the program at Shirati Hospital, more than one thousand women are screened for cervical cancer during a year.

Donations also fund solar electricity projects at clinics that are run by Shirati Hospital. The value of solar power is evident in one dramatic story that comes from Rosa Onyango, a dedicated nurse at the Burere clinic, which has struggled for years without electricity. When a pregnant woman showed up at the clinic in the middle of the night several months ago, Onyango had to hold a flashlight in her mouth while delivering the baby. Now, thanks to solar electricity systems newly installed at the Burere and Nyamasanda clinics, Onyango and the medical staff can focus on their care for patients.

Also a priority for Friends of Shirati is the expansion of a disability assistance program, which work with people with disabilities within their communities near the hospital.

Since its founding in 2005, Friends of Shirati has worked toward flourishing, sustainable, and healthy communities in Tanzania via partnerships with Shirati Hospital, Shirati College of Health Sciences, and the Shirati Leprosy compound. Friends of Shirati assists in developing and expanding the medical work, providing educational assistance, and offering support for those living with leprosy.

Friends of Shirati is grateful for donations and for the generous support. Mark your calendars now for the annual Friends of Shirati banquet on Saturday, March 9, 2019. The banquet will be held at 6:00 pm at the Gathering Place in Mount Joy, Pennsylvania. ## CELEBRATING TEN YEARS OF SERVICE IN THE NAME OF CHRIST

Did you know that March 2019 marks TEN YEARS of engaged involvement on the part of Slate Hill Mennonite Church with the Cumberland Vista Group Home in Dillsburg? Prior to 2019, Slate Hill's only involvement with Cumberland Vista was sending a \$100 annual check to C.R.O.S.S., the parent organization of Cumberland Vista. But in March 2009, God ignited a missional spark. Evangelism, Peace and Service (EPS) commission members were sent out to learn more about the organizations supported by the church. Ulli Klemm was assigned to learn more about Cumberland Vista.

In January 2009, Ulli visited Luanne Preece, who at the time was the Cumberland Vista house parent. In response to being asked what would be most helpful to the group home, Luanne wondered if Slate Hill volunteers could visit the group home the first Friday of each month and lead a time of Christian Fellowship.

In March 2009, Slate Hill volunteers led by the late Jim Burkholder, Cindy Musselman and Ulli Klemm began what is now a ten-year partnership with the residents and staff of Cumberland Vista. The original programming included singing and a Bible skit performed by the residents followed by refreshments. Since that humble beginning, Slate Hill has also assisted the residents in decorating Christmas cookies, making pumpkin pies and churning homemade ice cream. Additional activities included attending Bears' Hockey and Harrisburg Senator Baseball games, the Allenberry Playhouse, rides on the Pride of the Susquehanna, days of fun at Knoebles Park and many more special events. Funds for these special events have come from designated donations to the Cumberland Vista Fund (account #482-108) and the chicken BBQs.

In September 2016, Slate Hill began offering a V.I.P. Sunday School Class the third Sunday of each month. It was initially led by Ulli Klemm and is now facilitated by Matt Bergey.

God has taught us so much about grace, gratitude and faithfulness through our relationship with Cumberland Vista and Slate Hill volunteers have experienced much laughter and joy with the residents. The program has grown a mutual love and appreciation between volunteers and these precious saints.
